THORNTON STEWARD SAILING CLUB

Background

Thornton Stewards Sailing Club is based at Thornton Steward Reservoir, 5 miles west of Bedale, North Yorkshire, at the entrance to Wensleydale.

At 35 acres it is large enough to give good tactical racing, yet small enough to feel safe for the nervous or newcomer as all areas of the water are visible from the clubhouse.8

A small family club of about 70 memberships, a wide range of dinghies are sailed as well as windsurfers. The main season runs April to October, though sailing is permitted all year during daylight hours. Members carry out safety boat duty using club powerboats.

As a RYA Training Centre the Club offers courses and training for both dinghy sailing and powerboat handling. Windsurfing is also sometimes available.

Youngsters are particularly welcome with special junior courses and a Junior Club.

The Club is fortunate in owning a number of dinghies for members without boats to sail.
