Now well known <u>storm names</u>, with many of us feeling their effects on our properties recently!

The UK seems to have been battered with high winds and storms continually since the beginning of the year.....As a result, our Bosuns and various members have reported damage to boat covers and craft berthed in the boat park. Whilst e-mail communications are sent out to alert members to check their craft and attend to any issues, frustratingly a few members haven't visited the park to re-secure their boat or to check that their craft hasn't caused any damage to neighbouring berths.

Please remember that any craft berthed or sailed at the club must be fully insured....Including, Paddleboards, Canoes and Kayaks. Boat insurance must also have a minimum of £5M public liability cover. Records of boat insurance policies should be registered on the individual's membership records and maintained with current provider name, policy number/s, expiry date/s. Following storms, there have been several insurance claims made already this year.

Our event calendar starts with 2 Safety boat days beginning 5th March, designed to introduce members to the workings of our safety boat, equipment and basic recovery techniques.

If you haven't previously crewed a safety boat, this is an ideal taster session before progressing towards "PB2" -Sailing Courses Scheduled the RYA' Powerboat Level 2 qualifications that we hope all members will aspire to.

The club is committed to operating our safety boat facilities under the RYA recommendations that all handlers should become PB2 Qualified users.

All courses and club boat hires have now been published and can be booked through our online booking system.

Sailing Courses for 2022

We run various approved RYA certificated courses, primarily to teach new members how to sail and then to develop skills and confidence.

The key RYA courses which we run for adults and older teenagers are the National Sailing Scheme: Level 1 Start Sailing - An introduction to sailing dinghies for complete beginners, covering everything you need to know to get afloat under supervision. Level 2 Basic Skills - Build your confidence and develop your skills. By the end of this course, you'll be a competent sailor in light winds.

Each level usually takes 2 days to complete and is run over 1 or multiple weekends.

Beginners are strongly recommended to complete both courses in a season to equip themselves with the core skills you'll need to start boating independently.

Level 1 and 2 courses are usually taught in larger dinghies (Wanderers)

with a ratio of 1 instructor to 2 trainees, with trainees taking turns to helm or crew in the boat and the instructor either stays with you in the boat or provides close supervision from a powerboat or the shore.

Depending on numbers, these courses may alternatively be taught in single-hander dinghies (Fusions) which you will sail on your own under close supervision in a group of up to 6 per instructor.

Junior & Youth Training

We offer courses from the RYA Youth Sailing Scheme for younger members (8-16 years):

Stage 1 Start Sailing (beginner) - An introduction to the parts of the boat and the basic principles of how to get a boat sailing.

Stage 2 Start Sailing (beginner, intermediate) - Develop the skills needed to sail around a course and understand the basic principles needed to become a confident sailor.

Stage 3 Start Sailing (beginner, intermediate) - Build your confidence and develop the skills needed to sail in different directions in moderate conditions.

Stage 4 Start Sailing (beginner, intermediate, advanced) - Learn how to sail a double-handed boat as crew or helm and solve a variety of problems afloat

Powerboat Courses for 2022

Power boats are used by TSSC and CGSC to provide Safety cover at scheduled times and to support training activities.

All adult members are required to carry out at least 2 Safety boat duties per year as a condition of membership. Our team of Power Boat Instructors are focussed on upskilling members to become competent power boat helms so they can carry out Safety boat duties effectively and safely.

Key to this is the RYA Power Boat Level 2 course, which

can be completed in 1 or 2 days. Instructors also provide 'Safety Boat familiarisation' days to introduce members to basic handling of TSSC's Rigiflex powerboats and provide a pre-cursor to completing the Powerboat Level 2 course.

> All adult members are required to complete the Safety Boat Familiarisation course and it is an ambition to then progress to full PB2 Status.

RYA Powerboat Level 2 course provides the skills and background knowledge needed by the competent powerboat driver and is the basis of the International Certificate of Competence.

PB2 aims to teach boat handling and seamanship in powerboats, focussing on on low-speed close quarters handling, man overboard recovery, an introduction to driving at planing speed, and collision regulations.

The certificate issued will be endorsed to show the type of boat in which the training took place.

Did you know an RYA PB2 qualification allows the holder to use anywhere in the UK or overseas to hire and handle a powerboat.

This is a universally recognised power boat certificate. Our PB2 course on 28/29th May is your chance to gain this useful qualification.

The Bosuns, would like to thank all the Helm's from last season for completing the Day Book held in Robinson, this meant that the outboards were serviced appropriately for the amount of running hours, which helps keep the costs down; Both Honda outboards have been serviced and the Suzuki checked-out ready for the new season. Completing the Day Book also helps us to keep on top of any repairs needed.

During the winter we added extra tie downs to many of the boats and used Club ropes to help keep your boats on their berths. As the good weather returns please give us back the extra ropes! A number of boats sustained damage in the storms, we tried to notify all concerned, we put boats back on their trailers so if your boat does not look the way you remember leaving it, it may be prudent to give it a good check over; we also secured a lot of boat covers that had come undone.

There are a number of boat trailers that have flat tyres. May we also ask all those members who have their boats and launch trailer still on road trailers to take them off the road trailer and store the road trailer in the parking area behind Robinson please as the road trailers are longer than the boat berth which means neighbouring boats have difficulty in getting their boats off the berth to sail.

DON'T FORGET TO MARK YOUR NAME ON ANY TRAILERS TOO.

We need to replace a number of tie down points, as the wet weather and strong winds combined to pull some out of the ground, so we will be doing this in the weeks to come. If you haven't checked your boat recently it may be a good idea to come up and check it over before the sailing season starts.
