

## WELCOME TO THE 2021 SAILING SEASON

Irrespective of the adage that 'Life is what happens while you are busy making Plans', your Committee has scoped out a plan for the next few months. While the arrangements are described in detail elsewhere, in summary, the Club will start where it left off just before Lockdown 3.0 last year.

Sailing will start on 29 MAR 21. The Clubhouse will still be closed, but there will be access to the Clubhouse Toilets.

Club boats will be available for an extended loan, the duration depending on the demand, but the previous constraints on numbers on the

water and the upper wind speed will still apply as there will be no rostered Safety Boat.

The hope is that it will be possible to start some organised activities at the end of April, and I would like to encourage all Members, in the interim, to take advantage of the courses that will be laid on to refresh and extend capabilities in handling the Safety Boats viz a refresher/initial training

on the Rigiflex Boat, and a familiarisation course on the Blue Boat for competent helms.

Beyond April it remains to be seen where the Country is with the pandemic restrictions, but the Committee has inked in the diary a camping/caravanning week at the end of August and plans are being developed for that week to include activities for everybody to celebrate a return to more usual circumstances. Fingers crossed.

For some of us it is many months since we have sailed, possibly not since the end of the summer season in 2019. So long ago. It won't just be our boats and equipment that will need checking out and fettling in preparation for going on the water, but also our minds and muscles!

Watch out for PTSD - 'Pre-sailing Traumatic Stress Dysfunction'. Symptoms will undoubtedly include discovering that the wet suit has shrunk by a couple of sizes and at least one return trip home is needed to round up all the kit needed that you forgot for the first trip.


If all goes to plan, we'll be staging a welcome back event for up to 30 on 22<sup>nd</sup> May.

## At last some light at the end of the tunnel!

Following the government's announcement of their roadmap to recovery, the committee are now in a position to plan our own return to activities at Thornton Steward.

In conjunction with advice from the RYA and government guidelines, we are planning to lift restrictions in 4 stages in line with the national relaxation of COVID-19 measures.

Limited services will also be available - e.g. toilets will be open as from 29<sup>th</sup> March.

## REOPENING ARRANGEMENTS AS FROM 29TH MARCH

A RETURN TO BOOKINGS, TRACK & TRACE AND SOCIALLY DISTANCING AT OUR CLUB FACILITIES

Sailing at the club may commences from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> March. Stage 1 Recreational sailing/water sports restarts for individuals or groups following the rule of 6 or 2 households restrictions. Clubhouse toilets available. Access to club/water must be booked online (numbers capped)

All sailing slots, must be pre-booked through the club's booking system, tickets will be limited to the maximum capacity in line with each stage of restrictions.

Stage 2 on 12<sup>th</sup> April, changing facilities may open

Racing will likely restart with the first sunset series race scheduled for 28<sup>th</sup> April, bookings are required.

On 17<sup>th</sup> May we will be implementing Stage 3 allowing a maximum of 30 people to use our outside space and planning a "Welcome Back" day on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> May as a celebration of the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions, booking required. Limited safety boat cover is being considered from 17<sup>th</sup> May.

Finally if all goes to plan, on 21st June the club will be operating as near to normal as we can under Stage 4, although we anticipate some social distancing measures may remain in place for some time.

## <u>MORE</u>....

## **CLUB FACILITIES DURING RETURN TO NORMAL ACTIVITIES**

As from 29<sup>th</sup> March, Sailing/Watersports may take place and we plan for toilet facilities to be available to members on site. The changing rooms, showers, lounge and galley areas may not be accessed during Stages 1 & 2, but will be reviewed as we approach Stage 3 Sanitising and all usual social distancing rules of "1 in -1" out must be observed,

there will be sanitising stations and products available to ensure safe usage of the toilet facilities are upheld. Your Key to the entrance gate will also allow access to the main door of the clubhouse and it is every member's responsibility to maintain security and checking all doors are locked before departing the site.

## STICK TO THE RULES AND KEEP EVERYBODY SAFE!

CLUB BOATS MAY BE LOANED FOR EXTENDED PERIODS UPON REQUEST.

In addition to the resumption of water based activities, the committee have decided to once again allow member's use of the club's dinghy fleet.

Previously we offered boat loans on a 4-day booking system with a 3-day quarantine period, however, we will be taking requests on an individual basis from members wishing to borrow club boats during the 4 stages before returning to full operations on 21st June.

If you would like to take advantage of borrowing a club boat, please contact the membership secretary here.

If available a boat can be allocated for your personal use on a fair usage basis, so you may be asked to relinquish your loan craft if demand exceeds the number of boats available.

Spare boat loans are also being made available on our booking system.

All social distancing measures will remain in place for accessing the Robinson building to gain access to club equipment. Follow the instructions on your booking tickets.



## SAFETY FIRST ONLY SAIL OR USE THE WATER WITHIN YOUR OWN CAPABILITIES.

- The following guidelines should be observed if taking to the water
- The upper limit is 20mph wind speed, do not sail in higher strengths
- If sailing/Paddleboarding/Kayaking/Canoeing make sure you have booked a place on our booking system
- When using the water outside the times at which safety boat cover is available, please try to sail/paddleboard etc with a buddy, or ensure there is someone ashore keeping an eye on you.
- If you are going to be at the reservoir alone, make sure somebody knows your plans
- During colder weather, you must have appropriate clothing and sailwear, that means a wet or dry suit.
- You must maintain social distancing If using the toilet facilities.
- Check the clubhouse is secure prior to departure.

## In other Bosun News

Syd and Bob are busily preparing all of our boats and equipment ready for reopening.

Syd says.... "Prior to the shutdown we had continued to fine tune the storage in the Robinson building to make it more user friendly".

The new engine trolley for the 10hp outboard is a big improvement on the old red one and we are in the process of procuring some new oars and boat hooks so that the three powerboats including our new single-hander all have identical equipment and ancillaries and we'll prepare a check list to make sure all helms of the safety boats are fully equipped for the water.



New tie down points that were installed previously have suffered from the high rainfall we had last year, more than usual, and the ground was saturated leading to one or two securing points popping out of the ground during the heavy winds. As soon as we can access the boat park we will be creating new tie downs.

Amongst other things we took all the wheels off the trolleys for the winter so we shall hopefully soon be putting everything back in place for sailing this year.

## CAN WE START RACING?



Organised sports are permitted from 29<sup>th</sup> March and we'll be starting the racing programme with the first Wednesday evening handicap race on 28<sup>th</sup> April - when the

clubhouse changing rooms should be open following Stage 2 resrictions being lifted.

We'll need volunteers to act as Race Officer for each session this can also be booked/volunteered using the online system.

......So please can all regular racers take a moment to allocate themselves <u>at least</u> 1 duty in each series of races that they'll take part in. We'll also be looking for safety boat volunteers to cover these sessions after 17<sup>th</sup> May, but in the absence of a safety boat- Racing will be on a 'buddy' basis.

## F A Q'S ABOUT RETURNING TO THE WATER

WHEN CAN I START TO USE THE WATER AGAIN?

Access to the water to sail, Paddleboard etc can begin from 29th March, but to limit numbers and keep a record for track and trace purposes you must book a slot using the online system

CAN I USE THE CLUB HOUSE?

The toilets can be accessed from 29th March but only one person/household group in the clubhouse at a time please.

The rest of the clubhouse remains closed until 12th April at the earliest – this includes using the changing rooms for storing gear, getting changed etc.

WILL THERE BE ANY SAFETY BOAT COVERAGE?

Until social distancing is eased from 21st June, the Safety Boats will be crewed by one person alone or two members of a single bousehold

All crew must have (as a minimum) completed the 'Safety Boat Familiarisation Course' Video theory session and practical instruction

It's really important people sign up to do the powerboat courses, as the more trained crews there are, the more safety boat cover we can provide – it's a simple as that!

The amount of cover this season will depend on the number and availability of trained volunteers, but the goal is to provide Safety cover on Sundays and Wednesday evenings from 17th May, plus Saturdays from 21st June.

You'll be able to volunteer yourself for Safety boat duty through the booking system. We can't guarantee all the slots will be filled with volunteers, so if you want to check whether there will be a safety boat present on a particular day, please check online to see if a crew has been allocated for that day.

As always, please only sail/paddle if you are confident in the prevailing conditions and the forecast is for wind speeds less than 20mph. If sailing outside the times when safety cover is available, do consider sailing with a buddy or having someone ashore who can keep an eye on you.

### IS ANY TRAINING BEING PLANNED?

Yes! The initial push early in the season will focus on powerboat training, with our Powerboat Instructors offering both online courses on handling the safety boats and following this up with water-based sessions to both familiarise crews with operating the boats and refreshing skills.



TSSC will again team up with Catterick Garrison Sailing Club to provide a programme of sail training for youths and adults at different levels.

The number of spaces and type of course will depend on progress through the Covid-19 Roadmap and demand, but we are planning to start with a youth course on w/c 31<sup>st</sup> May and run several series of 3 or 4 day courses throughout the school summer holiday and in October.

We'll also be looking at running sessions covering the basics of racing and the Race Officer role. The Instructors are meeting soon and more information will be announced shortly.

## THE TRAINING CREW ARE PREPARING FOR SOME ACTION IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

It has only been on-line so far with a couple of refresher sessions around Safety Board operations; an excellent presentation by Darren Kirkham (Army Sailing Association Regional Coach) on the course for Senior Instructor certification, and next week an on-line session for all instructors to review our resources and our plans for the year.

Ensuring Members are confident and capable in handling the safety boats is important for everyone's peace of mind. In April there will be :-

- 1. A familiarisation and practical handling session for competent helms on the new addition to the fleet, known as the Blue Boat. It's smaller and lighter than the Rigiflex and so the handling is noticeably different.
- 2. Practical work with the bigger Safety Boats for everyone, either as a refresher or first-time training.

As the COVID restrictions are gradually eased the next priority will be the RYA dinghy sailing course for those members starting out in sailing.

More information will be communicated as and when the dates can be firmed up.
